- Use a defined timeline, roles and success criteria.
- Collect evidence for future funding or expansion.

Amplify Youth	Youth centres, schools, councils	Story plans, video clips, screening pathway
Digital confidence	Libraries, councils, community orgs	Participant support sessions, plain-language resources
NDIS Navigator	Disability providers, community services	Planning worksheets, support pathway
EMLS module pilot	Education/disability settings	Module cards, facilitator notes, reflections
Spatial Learning Node demo	Museums, libraries, festivals	Prototype demonstration and feedback

Partner role

- Confirm audience and venue fit.
- Support recruitment and local communication.
- Share access and safety requirements early.
- Participate in evaluation and feedback.

EduLinked role

- Provide program design and accessible resources.
- Support facilitation model and plain-language materials.
- Provide reporting structure and improvement loop.
- Support next-step planning after pilot delivery.

Pilot success measures

- Participant attendance and engagement.
- Participant confidence or clarity before/after.
- Accessibility adjustments requested and provided.
- Partner satisfaction and feasibility.
- Evidence of learning, participation or pathway creation.

Access and inclusion commitment

EduLinked designs resources to be clear, flexible and usable across different communication, literacy, sensory and support needs. Access needs can be discussed before participation or partnership is confirmed.
